PHIL REID MEMORIAL TROPHY 2024/25

This year, 30 players entered the Phil Reid Memorial Trophy run by Leicestershire Table Tennis Association -a slight decrease but there was some great table tennis in a good atmosphere-maybe the best set of qualifiers and final in my time.

Two qualifying sessions were held at Knighton Park TTC on Monday 30 December and Thursday 2 January with 17 players scheduled for first and 13 for second - each respectively in groups playing best of 3 up to 21. There were some very close matches in some groups as would be expected in a handicap competition. The players ranged in gradings – with 175 difference between top and bottom and with the highest start being 11.

The winners of the 8 groups were Tony Monteiro (Goons) Oz Akyildiz. Jack Bitenieks, Ayhan Celik, Dillon Kearney, Khaalid Patel, (Knighton Park), Eiz Eddin Al Katrib (QTTC) Elly Bajarias(Winstanley Wizards)

The Finals were played on Saturday January 4th at Knighton Park with 2 round robin groups of 4 players leading to semi- finals and final.. In the semi-finals, Khaalid beat Dillon 21-13,14-21, 21-14- a great battle between 2 of our top juniors- and Ayhan beat Oz 10-21, 21-14,21-18 - another fascinating match between compatriots. So to the Final which was won by Ayhan 22-20,21-14 with Ayhan having 5 start – another excellent match .

Congratulations to Ayhan on winning the Phil Reid Memorial Trophy this year and to Khaalid for being a very good runner -up. Interestingly it was a final between finals group runners -up.

There were many cracking group matches and all players had their moments but I am sure all will agree that the match between Ayhan and Elly in the group was special- Elly won 21-14,21-23, 22-20- and the other match waited to start their next game to see the end as the watchers applauded a superb match of ebb and flow. In that group, Ayhan, Elly and Tony all won one while Dillon won three and Ayhan went through as runner -up by one game on countback- such are the margins.

Many thanks to Knighton Park for the use of their facilities, to Andy Wright for his wise advice and the gradings review, to all who helped set up and tidy up - as well of course to all the players for participating and playing in a really good spirit. It remains a huge pleasure to run this competition in memory of a major figure in the county's history.
